MBIE/AD/R/2021/2: Application for review of anti-dumping duties on preserved peaches from Spain

This letter is to advise you that, pursuant to section 17D of the Trade (Anti-dumping and Countervailing Duties) Act 1988, on 3 August 2021 the New Zealand Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) started a full review of the anti-dumping duties currently in place on imports of preserved peaches from Spain (Review).

The goods subject to review (the subject goods) are:

Peaches in preserving liquid, in containers up to and including 4.0kg.

A copy of the New Zealand Gazette notice of the start of the Review is **enclosed**. The non-confidential application from the domestic industry alongside MBIE's Initiation Memorandum will be available shortly at https://www.mbie.govt.nz/business-and-employment/business/trade-and-tariffs/trade-remedies/trade-remedy-investigations/.

The Review will determine whether continued imposition of anti-dumping duties is necessary to offset dumping and whether material injury to the domestic industry is likely to continue or recur if the duties expire or are otherwise removed.
