Dear Secretary Lutnick and Secretary Barton:

On behalf of the Coalition of Freight Coupler Producers ("CFCP" or "Petitioner"), we hereby submit to the U.S. Department of Commerce ("Commerce") and the U.S. International Trade Commission (the "Commission") petitions for the imposition of antidumping and countervailing duties on U.S. imports of freight rail couplers from Czechia and India, pursuant to

sections 701, 702(b), 731, and 732(b) of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (the "Act") (19 U.S.C.

§§ 1671, 1671a(b), 1673, and 1673a(b)). CFCP is an association, whose members are comprised

of (1) a manufacturer of in the United States of the domestic like product, ¹ and (2) a certified union

or group of workers that is representative of an industry engaged in the manufacture in the United

States of a domestic like product.² Accordingly, CFCP is an interested party within the meaning

of 19 U.S.C. § 1677(9)(F) and 19 C.F.R. § 351.102(b)(29)(viii).

Volume I of the petitions contains general information and the allegations of injury, along

with associated exhibits. Volumes II and III contain the antidumping allegations and associated

exhibits. Volume IV contains the countervailing duty allegations and associated exhibits. There

are business proprietary and public versions of Volumes I, II and III. Volume IV does not contain

any business proprietary information and is being submitted as a public document.

Pursuant to section 351.202(c) of Commerce's regulations, we certify that the petitions and

all required copies were filed today with both Commerce and the Commission. These petitions

are being filed through Commerce's ACCESS electronic filing system and through the

Commission's EDIS electronic filing system.
